

The field of forestry

Management of the state-owned forests is performed by different types of state organizations.

Biological diversity

Belarus has been a signatory of the CITES Convention since 1995. CITES requirements are respected in forest management, although there are no species included in the CITES lists in Bearus.

Forest regeneration is carried out annually over an area of 32,000 ha, including 81% of the forest planting and seeding and 19% by natural regeneration.

There are 2 strictly protected Nation reserves and 4 National parks present in Belarus at the moment. Area of National reserves accounts 2,98 milj ha and area of National parks is 3,98 milj ha.

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Forest and community

In 2018 in all kinds of felling there were harvested 19,5 million m3 marketable timber.

Forest products and export services totaling more than \$ 140 million. USA. USD, accounting for 94% by 2017. In comparable conditions (excluding the sale of timber for export in previous years) due to the development of its own woodworking capacities, export growth was 174%.

In 2017, out of total exports, round timber was sold in value terms - 45%, sawn timber sales - 37%, peeled, cylindrical products - 4% and other products - 14%.

Considering that in 2018, the export of round timber was not carried out, organizations had to export the volumes of wood processing products, which in terms of value showed: sawn products - 56% of total sales for export, cylindrical products - 6% and other products - 36%.

Timber exports in 2018 are expressed in percent by CIS countries: Lithuania - 25%, Latvia - 28%, Germany - 24%, Poland - 15.2%, Belgium - 5.4%, the Netherlands - 3.0%, Romania - 2.0%, Azerbaijan - 1.5%, Sweden - 1.4%, Russia - 1.1%, and others - 1.2%.

Certification

All forest area is certified by PEFC certification scheme. 7,9mil. Ha of total area of the forest fund (93 forestry) are certified according to PEFC.

FSC 7,1 mil. ha of total area of the forest fund (90 forestry) are certified according to FSC FM standards. Both the FSC and PEFC systems have found their way into Belarus.

2.2 Actions taken to promote certification amongst feedstock supplier

Our company have SBP certificate. But we have expanded, and now we have two pellet factories.

According to first factory: during first reporting period, the share of certified feedstock was approx. 14% and this figure was increased during second reporting period up to 84,33%. At 2017 year we had increased level of certified feedstock until 89.81%. In 2018 we have refused from non-certified feedstock fully.

The company's policy is to give a preference to certified suppliers and fully refuse to non-certified suppliers. Supply base is almost always certified among the whole Republic of Belarus. Feedstock (sawdust) consists of sawmill residues from main production of suppliers. Therefore, uncertified and new suppliers are invited to certify their chain of custody and get benefit from utilising their residues.




2.3 Final harvest sampling programme

Secondary feedstock (sawdust and woods), using for producing of wood pellets at our factory, delivered from certified suppliers (i.e. forestry and national parks).

In the process of harvesting and subsequent processing at the sawmills waste is separated. In our case it is firewood (i.e., slab, a curve of rotted roundwood).

The calculation of the percentage of incoming raw materials is based on data obtained from the accounting department.
